

**COVID-19 Vaccine Booster Shots (3<sup>rd</sup> Dose) Available**

In Tsukuba city COVID-19 vaccine booster shot is provided to those who completed their primary vaccination (2 doses) after at least 6 months interval. Vaccines approved for the booster shots are Pfizer and Takeda/Moderna (depending on vaccine supply from the central government, vaccine types used in medical institutions may be subject to change). The Vaccination Vouchers for the 3<sup>rd</sup> dose will be sent to eligible people after 6 months from the 2<sup>nd</sup> dose. If you want to get vaccinated, please make a reservation when you receive the Vaccination Voucher. **If you do not receive your voucher, you may need to apply for its issue.**

※If the interval for vaccination is changed by the government, we will inform you via Tsukuba city homepage.

**■Booster shots are available for those who fulfill all of the following conditions**

- ▶ People who had 2<sup>nd</sup> dose of their primary vaccination at least 6 months ago
- ▶ People aged 18 years and older
- ▶ People completed their primary vaccination (2 doses) with Pfizer, Takeda/Moderna or AstraZeneca which are approved by the Japanese pharmaceutical authority.

**■Schedule for sending out the Vaccination Vouchers**

To those who completed their primary vaccination before August 16, 2021 the Vaccination Vouchers for the 3<sup>rd</sup> dose have been sent. If you had your vaccination after August 17, please check the voucher shipment schedule on the right.

**■Applying for issue of the 3<sup>rd</sup> dose Vaccination Voucher**

Please send the registration form (available on the city webpage) via post or city webpage if any of these conditions apply to you.

- ▶ If you moved to Tsukuba after April 2021, and have not applied for issue of the Vaccination Voucher (including reissue).

- ▶ If you do not receive the voucher after one week from the scheduled date above.

**■Please note when applying for issue of the Vaccination Voucher**

Please attach “Vaccine Passport” or “Record of Vaccination” (stating the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> doses). In case you lost them, bring a document showing “my number” and apply at the Vaccine Distribution Office.



### ■COVID-19 Vaccination for Children

Currently we are making preparations to begin vaccinating children aged 5 to 11 from March 2022, as soon as the delivery of vaccines for children is completed. However, the information about vaccines may be subject to change. Please check the latest updates on Tsukuba city multilingual homepage.

### ■If you have not been vaccinated with the 1<sup>st</sup> and the 2<sup>nd</sup> doses yet

For those who have not been vaccinated yet, registration for the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> doses is available. Please make a reservation using the Vaccine Voucher that was sent to you. Also, please note that the old format of the Prevaccination Screening Questionnaire cannot be used. Check the details on the city website.

### Providing Special Benefit for Households Exempted from Municipal Tax

Special benefit of 100,000 yen will be provided for households exempted from municipal tax in order to support people struggling with difficulties caused by long-term influence of coronavirus spread. Please check how to apply, the period of registration and other details on the city website.

### The 119 Number for Fire and Medical Emergency Services

●If you do not speak Japanese, please stay on the line. An interpreter will join the call between you and the operator. Our interpreting service is available 24/7/365 in 21 languages.

Languages available: English, Chinese (Mandarin), Korean, Thai, Vietnamese, Indonesian, Malay, Tagalog, Nepalese, Burmese, Khmer, Mongolian, Sinhala, Hindi, Bengali, Portuguese, Spanish, German, French, Italian, Russian.

◇When you call 119, remain calm and answer the operator's questions needed for an ambulance dispatch.

·Is it a fire or medical emergency?

·Location: tell the place of the fire or medical emergency

※If you do not know the address, describe a nearby building or an intersection as a landmark.

·Describe the situation

In case of fire: what is burning, what is the intensity of the fire, are there any injured or unable to evacuate.

In case of a medical emergency: who needs help, what are the symptoms and for how long, what part is injured.

·Your information: give your name and a phone number that can be contacted after the call ends.

※Ambulance service is available for anyone with sudden illness or serious injury.

### The 110 Police Emergency Number

●Dial 110 to report an accident or a crime. Basic English language is spoken at Ibaraki Prefectural Police 110 number. Other languages interpretation is available with the aid of an interpreter. Please let the operator know what language you can speak.

◇When you call 110, the operator will ask the following questions.

·Is it a crime or an accident?

·When did it happen?

·Where did it happen?

·Have you seen the criminal or the car number plate?

·What is the condition of the crime/accident scene? ·Your information (name, nationality, language).

### ●Police Consultation Service #9110

In case you want to consult the police, but it is not the emergency, dial #9110.

Using 110 number in non-emergency cases may cause obstruction of an emergency communications.

Mount Tsukuba Plum Festival and Mito Ume Matsuri (Kairakuen) are known as two major Plum Blossom Festivals in Ibaraki Prefecture.

At Mt. Tsukuba there are over 1000 white and pink plum trees which bloom from late February till mid-March. Take the chance to visit Mt. Tsukuba while following the safety measures against risk of infections. We recommend wearing comfortable shoes as the event takes place at the mountain slope. There are direct buses to Mt. Tsukuba from Tsukuba center.

### Japanese Language Course for Foreigners on ZOOM (from April to July)

Online Japanese classes aimed to help in daily life will be held on ZOOM. Please check the city webpage for the details. Foreigners residing and working in Tsukuba and their family members (adults only) are eligible for this course. Day classes will be held from 10:00 to 11:00, evening classes - from 19:00 to 20:00. There will be 4 groups of different levels, and each group will have 15 classes. Ten people will be accepted to each group on the first-come first-served basis. Cost will be 2000 yen.

### Japanese Level Check and Consultations on Enrolment in Public Elementary and Middle Schools, Guidance on Entering High School

We provide information on elementary/middle school life, enrolment procedures and preparations on starting school, high school fees, entrance examinations, etc. Also, we advise on Japanese language education and achieving necessary level for taking classes and performing school activities.
