
# How to dispose of home computers

Please dispose of computers no longer needed at home in the following manner. The city does not collect them.

#### **Collection by Sagawa Express**

Free collection of disused home PCs by courier service is offered by Renet Japan Recycle Inc., under the "Small Home Appliance Recycle Law" and the agreement with the city.







- Make sure to delete all data yourself beforehand. (Free data erasure software is available.)
- Collection fee for 1 cardboard box containing a PC is free. (The sum of the three sides of the box must not exceed 140cm, less than 20kg)
- Other small appliances, printers and other computer accessories can be collected together.

# How to dispose of items subject to the Home Appliance Recycling Law

Air-conditioners, TVs, refrigerators, freezers, washing machines, and clothes dryers are required to be picked up and recycled by manufacturers by law. Therefore the city does not collect them. Please dispose of them by the following manner. (Recycling fee, and collection and transportation fee are required.)

#### For replacement

Request the store where the new product is purchased to pick up the old one.

#### Other than replacement

- 1) Request the store where you purchased the product to pick it up.
- 2 Request pick-up at a cooperative store for home appliance recycling collection.
- ③Purchase a home appliance recycling ticket at a post office and bring it directly to the pick-up location designated by manufacturer.

### Disaster debris



General garbage rules do not apply to disaster debris, such as wet furniture that cannot be reused.

## Small rechargeable batteries to be recycled

(Items for collection) Lithium-ion batteries Nickel-metal hydride batteries **Nicad batteries** 







The following batteries cannot be collected

Damaged or dismantled battery packs Batteries removed from battery packs Wet or swollen battery packs

#### How to put out

Insulate both poles of the battery with plastic tape or other insulation and put the batteries into the recycling box.

### **Collection site**

Tsukuba City Hall, Sustaina Square, electronics stores and other places

# Please follow the rules. There has been afire accident involving a garbage truck!


The fire accidents seems to have been possibly caused by highly flammable gases.

 Spray cans and cassette cylinders should be completely used up and put out on the day of spray cans after punching a hole in them.

- Disposable lighters should be completely out of gas before disposing of them on the collection day.
- Non-burnable garbage must be placed in a transparent or semi-transparent plastic bag.

Venting and punching a hole should be done in a safe place with no fire.
