

Mt. Tsukuba Gate Park has opened on November 3

Mt.Tsukuba Gate Park (4160 Hojo, Tsukuba) is a facility complex consisting of Tsukuba Geo Museum and Cycle Park Tsukuba. It was named with the hope that the park would serve as a gateway to discover the beauty of Mt. Tsukuba and its surroundings, and to enjoy it by Bike. We anticipate that it will become a beloved destination for visitors of all ages, offering them the opportunity to relish the natural beauty of Mt. Tsukuba. There is a free parking lot. If you are coming by bus from Tsukuba Center, you can take the Hokubu Shuttle or Oda Shuttle of Tsuku Bus.

Tsukuba Geo Museum



A Geopark is a designated area that is recognized and managed for its geological heritage and significance. It is a place where natural resources are protected, conserved, and made use of for education, tourism, and sustainable development. Mt. Tsukuba and its surrounding area have been certified as Mt. Tsukuba Area Geopark. The main facility of Geo Museum has a hands-on display where you can learn about the nature of Mt. Tsukuba Area Geopark and local culture.

Cycle Park Tsukuba

A bicycle facility featuring one of the largest BMX racing courses in Japan is now open. It is equipped with shower rooms, rest area and bicycle maintenance area. You can bring your own BMX or rent one along with cycling equipment for your first experience. Rental bicycles other than BMX are also available, allowing you to cycle the neighboring Tsukuba-Kasumigaura Ring-Ring Road and around the beautiful rural landscape at the foot of Mt. Tsukuba. Services such as BMX rental, and the use of racing course and shower are subject to fees.

- Closed: Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays (If a Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday is a national holiday, it will be open as a general rule and holiday will be rescheduled) New Year holidays (December 29 January 3)
- Entrance Fee: Free

Please file final tax return for the total income of 2023

Final tax return is the process of declaring your income for the previous year and the amount to be taxed out of it to the tax office. People who have income and have not undergone year-end tax adjustments at their workplace, or those with multiple sources of income, may be required to file a final tax return. By filing a final tax return, overpaid income tax is adjusted, and any unsettled payments are calculated. In case of failing to do so, health insurance and municipal and prefectural tax of the following year can become higher. The declaration can be submitted online (e-Tax), at Tsuchiura Tax Office or at Tsukuba City Hall.

Tsukuba City Hall reception period is as follow. <u>Prior appointment by internet or phone is required.</u> Further details will be posted on the official website of Tsukuba City.

Notice from the Animal Quarantine Service and Plant Protection Service of the Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries

To prevent animal diseases entering Japan, please do not bring meat such as chicken, beef, pork from abroad. Japan's livestock industry could suffer significant damage if a livestock disease enters the country. Not only raw meat, but also cooked meat or even meat bought at an airport outside Japan are prohibited and cannot be sent by mail, either. Illegally importing meat can result in fines or arrest. Please inform your relatives and friends not to send meat to Japan.

To prevent plant disease and pests entering Japan, certain fruits and vegetables are not allowed to bring in. This is the signature column of our foreign student CIRs translating this newsletter. In our previous edition, we asked about their favorite things in autumn. For winter, they explored how New Year is celebrated in Japan.

After that, people pay their first visit to a shrine or temple ("Hatsumode"). Now the most famous places get very crowded.
