Notice: Japanese Encephalitis Vaccination (1st term Booster Shot)

Vaccination period for 1st term booster shot is the day before reaching 7 years and 6 months old

This is a notice to parents with a child aged 4 years and 1 month, whose 1st term booster shot has not been confirmed by Tsukuba City.

Please kindly note that if your child has already completed the vaccination in other municipalities before moving to Tsukuba City, this card is not applicable.

Japanese Encephalitis (JE) requires a total of 3 doses for the first term: the first 2 doses and a booster shot.

If your child has not received the booster shot, please have your child vaccinated as soon as you can.

 Vaccination period for the booster shot: Until the day before your child turns 7 years and 6 months old.

<u>XONLy for residents registered in Tsukuba City on the vaccination day.</u>

The required vaccination period may vary depending on the number of doses your child has already received. However, it will take about 7 months for the shortest plan of 3 doses of JE Vaccination 1st term. We recommend planning your child's vaccination within the vaccination period above.

What to bring:

Pre-vaccination questionnaire (Yoshin hyo) of the JE Vaccination, Maternal and Child Health Handbook (Boshi techo), a document confirming age and address of your child (e.g., Health Insurance Card)

Where:

- ① Cooperating medical institutions (Scan the 2-D bar code)
- ② Medical institutions affiliated with the Ibaraki Medical Association
- ③ Other medical institution not listed above (prior application required)※1

※1 If the child vaccinated without application, you may have to pay the full amount of the vaccine fee. Please visit 'For Routine Vaccinations at a Medical Institutions other than Cooperating Medical Institutions' on the Tsukuba City website for details. ♦ Children must be accompanied by their guardian/ parent. If someone other than a guardian/ parent accompanies the child for vaccination, <u>a letter of</u> <u>authorization is required</u>.
